

Lewis Fisher discovered new information about the tannery complex, which served the Confederate Army from 1863-1865, during his research for his book, "Brackenridge: San Antonio's Acclaimed Urban Park." As a result, the Conservancy is literally digging deeper into the park's history to learn more about the untold stories, hiring a team from UTSA's Center for Archaeological Research. The excavations are being undertaken to explore the extent of the tannery structures to understand the architectural footprint and how the Confederates modified the 1776 Upper Labor dam and acequia, specifically the headgate area for the tannery. The investigations will inform the interpretative program. Thank you to the Semmes Foundation for a grant to underwrite this research.

New Bridge Connection to Brackenridge Park

David Adelman, founder and president of AREA Real Estate, "loves seeing things improve." He is standing on a new pedestrian river bridge, connecting his mixed-use development "The Creamery" to Brackenridge Park and public walkways leading south to Pearl and west to the former "12th hole" of the Brackenridge Golf Course.

The Creamery building, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was built in 1932 for Mistletoe Creamery and then sold to Borden Dairy. Partnering with Embrey Partners Ltd., Adelman repurposed the site, restoring the historic structure and creating a mix-used development including restaurants, office space and apartments. Thank you for providing new connections to Brackenridge Park and welcome to the neighborhood!
