Alpine Drive is home to joggers and hikers frequenting the park,
but it is not open to vehicular traffic. The outdoor picnic will have
everything you need for the perfect sky party.

This fundraiser picnic brunch will help the Conservancy fund special projects such as free programming and events in the park for the general public to enjoy. Free events throughout the park have included Parktoberfest, held every September and its upcoming Family Fishing Day scheduled for October 28.



Come drop a line in the river and see what you hook. Join us for our annual Family Fishing Day on Saturday, October 28! This event is free and open to the public.




